Session Overview: While opioid-related overdoses and death are lower in Hawaii than most of the continent, accidental drug poisonings are still one of the leading causes of accidental death in Hawaii. For the past 5 years since the passage of Act 68, community-based naloxone distribution and training has led to over 12,000 doses disseminated and over 500 overdose reversals reported. This panel will provide an update on the polices, activities and resources that are available in each county for training and how to access free naloxone.
